Constituent Relationship Management

The process where an organization administers interactions with constituents, typically using data analysis to study large amounts of data and information.

While many people think about commercial operations when they hear "constituent relationship management", nonprofits and public service organizations can benefit from implementing a CRM system.












Nonprofits and public service organizations are complex.

Some focus primarily on fundraising to fulfill their mission, with revenue generated through multiple types of giving.



In addition to revenue, these organizations need software to track expenses, generate reports, create and send donation acknowledgments and tax receipts, allocate certain funds to specific activities and more.



Most organizations find software that addresses fundraising needs. Many of these solutions are focused on events and donations and only meet some of the needs of the organization.

For example, a solution might allow the organization to track individual donations, online giving and have integrated payments and other tools that address the data related to these types of fundraising.

But they still need other software for gala management and to run auctions, so they find a tool to address this need.









